The Osceola City Council met in Regular Session at the Council Chambers, located at 303 West Hale Avenue, Osceola, Arkansas. The meeting took place on June 17, 2023 at 5:00pm.

Before meeting, there was a presentation of Championship rings to the Osceola football travel league.

Meeting was called to order by Mayor Harris. Jessica Griffin called roll and all Council members were present, except Tyler Dunegan who was absent.

Motion was made by Joe Guy and seconded by Linda Watson to approve June minutes. All Council members were in favor.

ORDINANCE MAD- 12

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE OSCEOLA, ARKANSAS ZONING CODE TO CREATE A NEW STEEL INDUSTRIAL ZONING DISTRICT, DECLARING AN EMERGENCY, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

WHEREAS, the City of Osceola, Arkansas desires to amend its zoning regulations to create a new zoning district to permit by right the manufacture of steel and other uses associated with steel manufacturing, to define "Steel Manufacturing" and other associated terms, to designate the lot coverage, yard, and off-street parking requirements applicable to uses in a Steel Industrial Zoning District, and for other purposes.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF OSCEOLA, ARKANSAS:

Section 1. Section 7.01.0 of the Osceola, Arkansas Zoning Code (Purpose of Each District) is hereby amended to add the following Section 7.01.03:

7.01.03. Steel Industrial (I-S):

The principal purpose of this Steel Industrial (I-S) district is to permit the operation of facilities, mills, and plants for the manufacture of steel and other metals, for the collection, processing, management, recycling and use of scrap metals and related recyclables, for the generation of electric power from photovoltaic panels, for the processing, management, recycling and use of slag and related recyclables, rail and railroad-related operations, port and port-related operations and other uses associated with the manufacturing and finishing of steel. In this district, occupants may conduct their operations and the storage of raw materials, fuels, collected scrap metals, slag, and inventory both within enclosed buildings and outdoors.

<u>Section 2</u>. Section 7.02.0 of the Osceola, Arkansas Zoning Code (Permitted Uses) is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 7.02.0. Permitted Uses:

The permitted uses in each of the residential districts are set forth in the following table. The following symbols, placed opposite a permitted use and underneath a residential zoning district, shall have these meanings:

"P" means that the listed use is permitted by right in that district.

"CU" means that the listed use is permitted subject to approval as a conditional use as set forth in Article XIV.

"X" means that the use is prohibited.

<u>Section 3</u>. Article XVII of the Osceola, Arkansas Zoning Code (Definitions) is hereby amended to add the following definitions:

Major Solar Facility: A transmission-interconnected solar energy system that utilizes solar collectors, controls, cells, panels, arrays, devices, materials, exchangers, hardware, and other equipment necessary to the process to collect and convert radiant energy received from the sun into electricity or other forms of energy, and shall include, without limitation, generating units, transmission facilities, substations, electric transformers, batteries and other energy storage facilities, operations and maintenance buildings, telecommunications equipment, roads, meteorological equipment, foundations, pads, footings, mounting structures, supports, foundations, fencing, reasonable signage and all related or ancillary improvements and equipment.

Metal Recycling Facility: A facility for the collection, storage processing, use and sale of scrap metals, and shall include facilities and uses integrally related to the Principal Use, such as employee training facilities; employee service facilities such as break rooms, infirmaries, lunchrooms, and locker rooms; central service facilities, and offices that are an integral part of the facilities. This definition includes and permits the outdoor collection, processing, use and storage of such materials.

Open Burning of Wood Crating Material: The controlled burning of wood crating material associated with other on-site activities pursuant to and in compliance with a permit issued by the Arkansas Energy and Environment Department, Division of Air Quality, and in coordination with the city's Fire Department.

River Port or Harbor: A facility for the docking, loading, unloading, and repair of barges and boats, and shall include fueling facilities and other facilities and uses integrally related to the Principal Use, such as employee training facilities; employee service facilities such as break rooms, infirmaries, lunch rooms, and locker rooms; central service facilities, and offices that are an integral part of the facilities. This definition includes and permits the outdoor storage of materials being loaded and unloaded from barges and boats.

Slag Recycling Facility: A facility for the collection, storage, processing, use, and sale of slag, and shall include facilities and uses integrally related to the Principal Use, such as laboratories; employee training facilities; employee service facilities such as break rooms, infirmaries, lunchrooms, and locker rooms; central service facilities, and offices that are an integral part of the facilities. This definition includes and allows the outdoor collection, processing, use, and storage of such materials pursuant to and in compliance with a permit issued by the Arkansas Energy and Environment Department, Division of Air Quality.

Steel Manufacturing: The manufacturing of steel or other metals from smelted ore or scrap metals through the use of heating or thermal melting, and the production of goods made from steel and other metals, and shall include facilities and uses integrally related to the Principal Use, such as laboratories; employee training facilities; employee service facilities such as break rooms, infirmaries, lunch rooms, and locker rooms; central service facilities, and offices that are an integral part of the facilities. This definition includes and permits the outdoor storage of raw materials used or generated in the manufacturing process, including scrap metals for recycling, slag for processing and reuse, and of manufactured products and inventory created from the manufacturing process.

Section 4. Section 7.03.0 of the Osceola, Arkansas Zoning Code (Lot, Yard and Height Requirements) is hereby amended as follows:

Section 7.03.0. Lot, Yard and Height Requirements:

Every building and use hereafter erected or located in a residential district shall have the lot area and widths identified below. No buildings shall be erected or enlarged unless the following yard setbacks are provided and maintained in connection with such building, structure, or enlargement.

Yard (front, rear, and side) are identified in the definition section of this Code. Front, side, and rear yard setbacks shall be measured from the property line or, when greater, the projected edge of the proposed street right-of-way shown on the Master Street Plan, The projection of open balconies, bay windows, and uncovered porches (patios) into yard space is permissible.

Chimneys, cooling or water towers, elevators, bulkheads, fire towers, monuments, stacks, storage towers, tanks, spires, church steeples, radio towers or necessary mechanical apparatus shall not be subject tot the height requirements.

<u>Section 5.</u> Article VII of the Osceola, Arkansas Zoning Code is hereby amended to add the following requirements for districts designated as Steel Industrial (I-S):

7.03.01. Rules Applicable Within Districts Designated Steel Industrial (I-S):

Within districts designated as Steel Industrial (I-S),

- 1. solar photovoitaic panels and all related equipment and devices constituting a Solar Generation Facility shall not be considered a "Building" and shall not be subject to a maximum building site coverage limitation; and
- 2. chimneys, cooling or water towers, elevators, bulkheads, fire towers, monuments, stacks, storage towers, tanks, spires, radio towers, or necessary mechanical apparatus shall not be subject to the height requirements; and
- 3. rail lines, spurs, switches. and related equipment may be located in any setback area; and
- 4. Front, Side-Street, and Rear setback requirements shall be 15 feet if the property is not adjacent to an "R" zoned district. The Side setback requirement shall be 10 feet if the property is not adjacent to an "R" zoned district.

<u>Section 6</u>. Section 7.04.0 of the Osceola, Arkansas Zoning Code (Performance Standards) is hereby amended as follows:

Section 7.04.0. Performance Standards:

Any industrial use established in the City of Osceola after the effective date of these regulations shall conform to the performance standards as set forth hereunder:

7.04.01. General:

Every use shall be so operated that it does not emit an obnoxious or dangerous amount of noise, vibration, heat, glare, radiation or fumes beyond: (A) any boundary line of the lot on which the use is located; or (B) if within districts designated Steel Industrial (I-S), the boundary of the district.

7.04.02. Noise:

For the purposes of these regulations, the emission of any frequently recurring sound inherent to business activities which unreasonably interferes with the use and enjoyment of other property and which exceeds seventy (70) decibels at: (A) any boundary line on the lot on which such sound is generated, or (B) if within districts designated Steel Industrial (I-S), any boundary line of the district, is considered dangerous.

7.94.03. Heat Radiation, Fumes, Smoke, Dust, and Electrical or Magnetic Interference and Explosive Hazard:

No use shall cause perceptible heat or radiation beyond the property line of the use, nor shall it pose danger to surrounding areas by reason of a fire, explosion or other safety hazard. No use shall cause electrical, magnetic or other interference with any use, process, equipment, appliance or device located beyond the property line of the property on which the use is located. The emission of glare, fumes, smoke or dust will be considered obnoxious when such emissions are dangerous, or constitute a nuisance to: (A) adjoining properties both within and beyond the boundaries of the Industrial District, or (B). if within districts designated Steel-Industrial (I-S), properties outside of the district.

Section 7. Article X of the Osceola, Arkansas Zoning Code (Use Standards and Special Provisions) is hereby amended to add Section 10.20.0 as follows:

Section 10.20.0. Application of Standards in District Zoned Steel Industrial (I-S):

- A. Section 10.01.0(C) (Accessory Buildings) shall not apply to Steel Industrial (I-S) districts.
- B. Section 10.06.0 (Fencing) shall not apply to Steel Industrial (I-S) districts.
- C. Section 10.07.0 (Flammable Liquids and Gases) shall not apply to Steel Industrial (I-S) districts. In districts zoned Steel Industrial (I-S), the storage of flammable liquids and gases shall comply with state and federal law. Facility owners will periodically inform Osceola Fire Department about all flammable liquid and gas storage on site to support emergency response preparedness.

- D. Section 10.14.0 (Storage Containers): Storage containers may be used as a matter of right in Steel Industrial (I-S) districts for temporary storage of construction materials, equipment, and tools, and for temporary storage of inventory and finished goods. No permit shall be required for such use.
- E. Section 10.16.0 (Sidewalks) shall not apply to the Steel Industrial (I-S) districts.
- F. Section 10.19.0 (Outdoor Storage and Waste Disposal) shall not apply to the Steel Industrial (I-S) districts. In districts zoned Steel Industrial (I-S), waste storage shall comply with state and federal law. Facility owners will coordinate any open burning with the Osceola Fire Department.

<u>Section 8</u>. Article XI of the Osceola, Arkansas Zoning Code (Signs) is hereby amended to add Section 11.12.0 as follows:

Section 11.12.0. Steel Industrial (I-S) District Exemption:

This Article XI shall not apply to Steel Industrial (I-S) districts. There shall be no restriction on the type or size of signs placed on property within a Steel Industrial (I-S) district and no permits or fees shall be required, except that (i) no sign shall be placed in a manner that would allow it to obstruct the vision of drivers and pedestrians at driveway entrances, and (ii) no sign shall be located within the designated safety zone of overhead electrical conductors as directed by the utility owner, or within 10 feet of a fire hydrant.

Section 9. Article XII of the Osceola, Arkansas Zoning Code is hereby amended to add Section 12.04.0 as follows:

Section 12.04.0. Special Rules in Steel Industrial (I-S) Districts:

- A. Section 12.01.02 and 12.02 shall not apply to Steel Industrial (I-S) districts.
- B. Within districts designated as Steel Industrial (I-S), the following rules shall apply:
 - Adequate areas shall be provided to park all employees' and customers' vehicles at all time and adequate space shall be provided for loading, unloading, and storing all vehicles used incidental to or as a part of the primary operation of the establishment. Not fewer than one (1) parking space shall be provided for each four (4) employees present at any given time. This requirement shall not apply during construction of improvements on the subject parcel.
 - ii. Portions of the site that are intended to be used for drives, parking, maneuvering and vehicular access to warehouse bays may be paved or graveled using asphalt, concrete, gravel, rock, slag, and other typical paving materials. No grass, ground cover or landscaping shall be required. The requirement for pavement, gravel, rock or other paving materials shall not apply during construction of improvements on the subject parcel.

- iii. No maximum width shall apply to driveways used for ingress and egress.
- iv. No buffers or enclosures of parking areas shall be required.
- v. The provisions in this Section 12.04.0 shall supersede any requirements in conflict herewith.

<u>Section 10</u>. All ordinances and resolutions, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 11. The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable and if any section, phrase, or provision shall be declared or held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect the remainder of the sections, phrases, or provisions.

Section 12. The City of Osceola, Arkansas recognizes: (1) the current interest to develop and build a steel mill and surrounding industry that would greatly benefit the city's economy and job market, and (2) the lack of a proper regulatory structure to manage such a development. Thus, in compliance with Section 14.03.0(B) of the Zoning Code and Ark. Code Ann. §14-56-423, the City Council determines that an emergency exists requiring the immediate protection of the welfare of the citizens of the City and this Ordinance is passed and the Zoning Code is amended by majority vote of the entire City Council.

Section 13. The City of Osceola, Arkansas recognizes: (1) the current interest to develop and build a steel mill and surrounding industry that would greatly benefit the city's economy and job market, and (2) the lack of a proper regulatory structure to manage such a development. Thus, finding that this ordinance is necessary for actions required immediately by the City and otherwise for the immediate protection of the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Osceola, Arkansas, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage.

CITY OF OSCEOLA, ARKANSAS RESOLUTION NO. 2023-29

A RESOLUTION BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF OSCEOLA, ARKANSAS CERTIFYING LOCAL GOVERNMENT ENDORSEMENT OF BUSINESS TO PARTICIPATE IN THE TAX BACK PROGRAM (AS AUTHORIZED BY SECTION 15-4-2706(D) OF THE CONSOLIDATED INCENTIVE ACT OF 2003)

WHEREAS, in order to be considered for participation in the Tax Back Program, the local government must endorse a business to participate in the Tax Back Program; and

WHEREAS, the local government must authorize the refund of local sales and use tax as provided in the Consolidated Incentive Act of 2003; and

WHEREAS, said endorsement must be made on a specific form available from the Arkansas Economic Development Commission; and

WHEREAS, Hybar LLC and its affiliates, including, but not limited to, Green & Clean Holdings LLC, Green & Clean Power LLC, Green & Clean Terminals LLC (collectively, the "Company") has sought to participate in the program and more specifically has requested benefits accruing from adding construction and equipment to the specific facility, to be located on approximately 1300 acres within all or portions of Sections 6, 12 and 13 in Township 12 North, Range 10 East of the Osceola District of Mississippi County, Sections 6, 7, 17 and 18 in Township 12 North, Range 11 East of the Osceola District of Mississippi County, and located east of Highway 61 and north and west of the steel mill operated by Big River Steel LLC; and

WHEREAS, the Company has agreed to furnish the local government all necessary information for compliance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Osceola, Arkansas that:

- **Section 1.** Hybar LLC and its affiliates, including, but not limited to, Green & Clean Holdings LLC, Green & Clean Power LLC, Green & Clean Terminals LLC (collectively, the "Company") be endorsed by the City Council of the City of Osceola, Arkansas for benefits from the sales and use tax refunds as provided by Section 15-4-2706(d) of the Consolidated Incentive Act of 2003.
- **Section 2.** The Department of Finance & Administration is authorized to refund local sales and use taxes to the Company.
- **Section 3.** *Effective Date.* This Resolution shall be in full force and effective immediately upon its passage and approval.

Street & Sanitation Department Update

The sanitation department is continuing to run smoothly without any major mechanical issues. Our commercial front-end loader is having a few mechanical issues. After cleaning and washing the truck. The driver can drive for about two hours then the truck gives and error to shut down and that there's some transmission issues. You wait about 15 minutes and the truck is back running fine. After much research the mechanic believes the issue is wire related, and we're still working on this issue. We did pick up some new commercial customers, and some existing customers increased their pickup route. The city needs more dumpsters because of the increase in commercial business. Transfer Station is complying with solid waste regulations and staying clean.

The street department has worked extremely hard at removing limbs from the July storm. We're using the chipper to help clean up debris and reduce our landfill tonnage. The department is working very hard to ensure all debris is picked up daily. The month of July has been extremely wet, and this hindered our ditch projects. The impact of this will move our forestry mulching project further back. It's the department's policy to ensure our streets are kept clean and look good daily, so we have a crew dedicated every Wednesday to making sure our streets and sidewalks are clean and grass is removed.

The street departments Knuble boom truck replaced the bucket to ensure all debris is being picked up and removed on every job site. We're still doing pothole repairs and if you have pothole issues in your ward, please notify me and we'll get them repaired.

Arkansas Department of Transportation, street overlay work has started.

Mosquito & Bird Control

Tim did an arial spray in July to help control the mosquito issue. He stated that he's working very hard spraying areas of high impact. He wanted me to let everyone know if you're having an event, please contact him and he will come spray the area before the event.

ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE ACCEPTING THE ANNEXATION OF CERTAIN TERRITORY TO THE CITY OF OSCEOLA ARKANSAS AND MAKING SAME A PART OF THE CITY OF OSCEOLA, ASSIGNING SAME TO A WARD, AND ASSIGNING A ZONING DESIGNATION.

WHEREAS, a Petition was filed pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. § 14-40-609 for the annexation of certain territory into the City of Osceola, Arkansas, and

WHEREAS, the County Assessor and the County Clerk of Mississippi County, Arkansas issued a Verification of Petition for Annexation Pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. § 14-40-609 verifying the Petition meets the requirements of Ark. Code Ann. § 14-40-609(b)(2) and presented the Petition and their verification to the County Judge of Mississippi County, Arkansas; and

WHEREAS, the County Judge has (i) reviewed the Petition and verification for completeness and accuracy, (ii) determined that no enclaves will be created by the annexation, (iii) confirmed that the Petition contains a schedule of services; and (iv) issued an order articulating these findings, authorizing annexation pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. § 14-40-609, and forwarded the Petition and order to the Mayor of the City of Osceola; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Osceola desires that the subject territory be annexed and become a part of the city.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF OSCEOLA, ARKANSAS:

Section 1. That the property described on the attached Exhibit A is contiguous to the City of Osceola, and that the same be and is hereby accepted as part of, and annexed to and made a part of the City of Osceola, Arkansas.

Section 2. That the following schedule of services shall be extended to the area by the City of Osceola within the statutorily required three (3) year period after the date the annexation becomes final, as follows: (i) police protection, (ii) fire protection, (iii) potable water service, (iv) sanitary sewer service, and (v) electric service to certain portions of the property to be annexed.

Section 3. That the above-described territory shall be annexed and made a part of Ward 1 of the City of Osceola, and the same shall henceforth be a part of said ward as fully as existing parts of said ward.

Section 4. That the above-described territory shall be zoned Steel Industrial (I-S) to be used in accordance with the City of Osceola zoning regulations and the laws of the State of Arkansas.

Section 5. Thirty (30) days after passage of this Ordinance, the annexation shall be final, and the property described in this Ordinance shall be within the corporate limits of the City of Osceola except as otherwise ordered by the Circuit Court of Mississippi County pursuant to a cause of action filed within said thirty (30) day period pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. § 14-40-609(g)(1) and (2).

Section 6. Within fifteen (15) days of the date of passage of this Ordinance the City Clerk shall provide a copy of this Ordinance and a copy of the plat map of the annexed property to the County Clerk of Mississippi County.

Section 7. The City of Osceola, Arkansas recognizes: (1) the current interest to develop and build a steel mill and surrounding industry that would greatly benefit the city's economy and job market, and (2) the benefits of annexing the site of such steel mill and related improvements into the City. Thus, in compliance with Section 14.03.0(B) of the Zoning Code and Ark. Code Ann. § 14-56-423, the City Council determines that an emergency exists requiring the immediate

protection of the welfare of the citizens of the City and this Ordinance is passed and the property described on Exhibit A is annexed to the City by majority vote of the entire City Council.

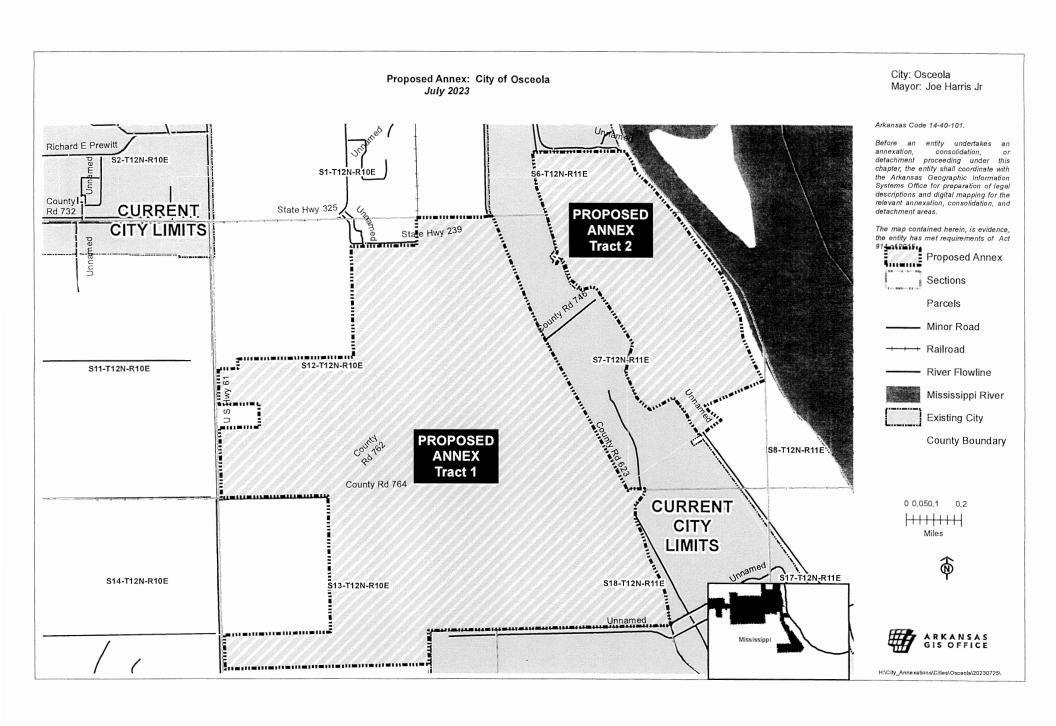

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AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING APPENDIX L TO THE ARKANSAS FIRE PREVENTION CODE OF 2021, REPEALING ORDINANCE 2010-870, DECLARING AN EMERGENCY, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

WHEREAS, the State of Arkansas has adopted the 2021 edition of the Arkansas Fire Prevention Code ("AFPC") based upon the 2021 edition of the International Fire Code, which supersedes and replaces previous editions, and encouraged cities and counties to adopt the same by local ordinance; and

WHEREAS, Section 101.2.2 of the AFPC provides that,

"Each district, county, municipality, or other political subdivision of this state shall only adopt and enforce the provisions of the Arkansas Fire Prevention Code, 2021 Edition. The AFPC 2021 Edition shall be the only foundation document available for modification by local jurisdictions should they choose to adopt more stringent provisions. It shall be the responsibility of local authorities having jurisdiction to bring the proposed specific rule or provision up to the minimum standards of the AFPC 2021 Edition. The State Fire Marshal shall advise local jurisdictions of any requirement that is less stringent than the AFPC Edition."

WHEREAS, the 2021 edition of the AFPC, like past editions, does not include Appendix L of the International Fire Code governing alternative seismic design requirements for certain buildings and Section 101.2.1 of the AFPC provides that, "Other appendices shall not apply unless adopted by local ordinance." and

WHEREAS, through the adoption of Ordinance No. 2010-870, the City of Osceola, Arkansas ("City") previously adopted Appendix L to the 2007 edition of the International Fire Code providing alternative seismic design requirements for certain buildings; and

WHEREAS, it is appropriate for the City to adopt the 2021 edition of the AFPC, as recommended and update Appendix L to the current version of the International Fire Code.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF OSCEOLA, ARKANSAS:

<u>Section 1</u>. The Arkansas Fire Protection Code, 2021 edition, is hereby adopted.

<u>Section 2</u>. Appendix L to the 2021 edition of the International Fire Code is hereby adopted, as follows:

L101.1 General. Every structure located where the 1-second spectral response acceleration, S₁, determined in accordance with Section 1613.2, is greater than 0.40 and either exceeds six stories in height with an aggregate floor area of 60,000 square feet (5574 m²) or more, or exceeds 10 stories in height regardless of floor area, shall be equipped with not fewer than three approved recording accelerographs. The accelerographs shall be interconnected for common start and common timing.

L101.2 Location. As a minimum, instruments shall be located at the lowest level, mid-height, and near the top of structure. Each instrument shall be located so that access is maintained at all times and is unobstructed by room contents. A sign stating "MAINTAIN CLEAR ACCESS TO THIS INSTRUMENT" in 1-inch (25 mm) block letters shall be posted in a conspicuous location.

L101.3 Maintenance. Maintenance and service of the instrumentation shall be provided by the owner of the structure. Data produced by the instrument shall be made available to the building official on request.

Maintenance and service of the instruments shall be performed annually by an approved testing agency. The owner shall file with the building official a written report from an approved testing agency certifying that each instrument has been serviced and is in proper working condition. This report shall be submitted when the instruments are installed and annually thereafter. Each instrument shall have affixed to it an externally visible tag specifying the date of the last maintenance or service and the printed name and address of the testing agency.

Section 3. A copy of this ordinance shall be forwarded to the Arkansas State Fire Marshal.

<u>Section 4</u>. Ordinance No. 2010-870 is hereby repealed. All ordinances and resolutions, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 5. The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable and if any section, phrase, or provision shall be declared or held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect the remainder of the sections, phrases, or provisions.

<u>Section 6</u>. The City of Osceola, Arkansas finds that updating current building codes is necessary for construction projects to proceed with greater predictability and efficiency, thus enhancing economic development within the City. Thus, as this ordinance is found to be necessary for the protection of the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of Osceola. An emergency is declared to exist, and this Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage.

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING APPENDIX 'L'
OF THE ARKANSAS FIRE PREVENTION CODE, 2007
PROVIDING AN ALTERNATIVE TO SEISMIC DESIGN
REQUIREMENTS REGARDING BUILDING AND OTHER
STRUCTURES CLASIFIED AS CATEGORY I AND II
OCCUPANCIES IN THE STATE OF ARKANSAS

WHEREAS, Appendix L of the Arkansas Fire Prevention Code, 2007 Edition, provides an alternative to seismic design requirements found in Chapter 16, Volume II of that Code regarding buildings and other structures classified as Category I and II occupancies, and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Osceola has determined there is a need to adopt Appendix L of the Arkansas Fire Prevention Code, 2007.

BE IT THEREFORE ORDAINED, that the City Council of the City of Osceola, Arkansas adopts the following:

SECTION 1. APPENDIX L

ALTERNATIVE SEISMIC DESIGN REQUIREMENTS FOR CATEGORY I AND II

BUILDINGS

SECTION L101

L101.1 Scope. This Appendix provides an alternative to seismic design requirements found in Chapter 16 regarding buildings and other structures classified as Category I and II occupancies meeting the criteria outlined in Sections L102. The provisions in this Appendix shall not apply unless specifically adopted by local ordinance.

SECTION L102

L102.1 Criteria. Projects electing to use this alternative must be buildings or other structures classified as Category I or II occupancies as described in the Table 1604.5, Arkansas Fire Prevention Code, Volume II, 2007 Edition, or in ASCE 7-05, Table 1-1, and must be constructed for manufacturing or industrial occupancy or for public works.

L1003.1 Structural Design Requirements.

In the case of eligible projects, the mapped 0.2-second and 1.0-second spectral response accelerations shown in IBC 2006 Figures 1613.5(1), 1613.5(2), 1613.5(7), and 1613.5(8) [ASCE 7-05 Figures 22-1, 22-2, 22-7, and 22-8], which reference a 2% probability of exceeding the design seismic event in a 50-year period may be substituted with mapped 0.2-second and 1.0-second spectral response accelerations documented in the "1997 NEHRP Recommended Provisions for Seismic Regulations for New Buildings", which reference a 10% probability of exceeding the design seismic event in a 50-year period.

L103.2 Designed Spectral Acceleration Parameters.

If Alternate mapped spectral response accelerations as noted in Section L103.1 are used, the following equations shall be substituted for equations 16-39 and 16-40 in IBC 2006 [equations 11.4-3 and 11.4-4 in ASCE 7-05].

L103.3 Seismic Base Shear.

If Alternate mapped Spectral response accelerations as noted in Section L103.1 are used, the design seismic base shear, V, in any given direction, shall not be less than that determined in accordance with the requirements of Section 1607 of the Standard Building Code.

SECTION 2. CONFLICTS

All regulations, ordinances, or parts of ordinances heretofore in effect which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance, to the extent of their inconsistency are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. SEPARABILITY

The invalidity of any section, clause, sentence, or provision of this Ordinance shall not affect the validity of any part thereof which can be given affect without such invalid part or parts.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF OSCEOLA, ARKANSAS, AN ORDINANCE TO BE ENTITLED:

AN ORDINANCE CALLING A SPECIAL ELECTION IN THE CITY OF OSCEOLA, ARKANSAS ON THE QUESTIONS OF ISSUING BONDS UNDER AMENDMENT NO. 62 TO THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS FOR THE PURPOSE OF FINANCING ALL OR A PORTION OF THE COST OF PARK AND RECREATIONAL IMPROVEMENTS; LEVYING A NEW SEVEN-EIGHTHS OF ONE PERCENT (0.875%) SALES AND USE TAX FOR THE PURPOSE OF RETIRING SUCH BONDS; AND PRESCRIBING OTHER MATTERS PERTAINING THERETO;

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Osceola, Arkansas (the "City") has determined that the City is greatly in need of park and recreational improvements including particularly, without limitation, an aquatic park and any necessary parking, landscaping, signage, drainage, concessions, lighting, road and utility improvements related thereto (collectively, the "Project");

WHEREAS, the City can finance all or a portion of the costs of the Project by the issuance of capital improvement bonds (the "Bonds") in one or more series in the maximum aggregate principal amount of \$____ under the authority of Amendment No. 62 to the Constitution of the State of Arkansas ("Amendment 62") and Title 14, Chapter 164, Subchapter 3 of the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated, as amended (the "Authorizing Legislation");

WHEREAS, the Authorizing Legislation provides for the levy of one or more city-wide sales and use taxes at the rate of 0.125%, 0.25%, 0.5%, 0.75% or 1% or any combination thereof, but not to exceed 1% in the aggregate;

WHEREAS, the City does not currently levy a sales and use tax under the authority of the Authorizing Legislation;

WHEREAS, the City can pay the principal of and interest on the Bonds from the proceeds of a new City-wide seven-eighths of one percent (0.875%) sales and use tax to be levied under the authority of the Authorizing Legislation solely for that purpose; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of this Ordinance is to submit to the electors of the City the questions of issuing the Bonds for the acquisition, construction, improvement, expansion, furnishing, equipping, operation and maintenance of the Project under Amendment 62 and the Authorizing Legislation at a special election to be called for that purpose and to levy a sales and use tax at the rate of seven-eighths of one percent (0.875%) on the receipts from the sales at retail within the City of all items which are subject to taxation under the Arkansas Gross Receipts Act of 1941, as amended (A.C.A. §§26-52-101, et seq.), and the receipts from storing, using, distributing or consuming within the City tangible personal property under the Arkansas Compensating Tax Act of 1949, as amended (A.C.A. §§26-53-101, et seq.) (collectively, the "Sales and Use Tax");

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Osceola, Arkansas:

Section 1. There be, and there is hereby called, a special election to be held on November 14, 2023, at which election there shall be submitted to the electors of the City the questions of issuing the Bonds under Amendment 62 and the Authorizing Legislation to pay all or a portion of the costs of accomplishing the Project in the maximum principal amounts described above, and to levy the Sales and Use Tax to be used after the State of Arkansas deducts its administrative charges and required rebates to pay the principal and interest of the Bonds.

Section 2. In order to provide for the payment of the principal of and interest on the Bonds and all obligations of the City in connection therewith, there is hereby levied the Sales and Use Tax. The levy of the Sales and Use Tax shall not become effective until the special election called in Section 1 above has been held and the issuance of the Bonds for one or more of the purposes and the levy of the Sales and Use Tax is approved by the voters. The Sales and Use Tax shall be levied and collected on the gross receipts, gross proceeds or sales price in the maximum amount allowed from time to time by Arkansas law, subject to rebates and limitations as from time to time required by Arkansas statutes for certain single transactions. The levy of the Sales and Use Tax shall not take effect until the issuance of the Bonds is approved by the voters as provided herein.

<u>Section 3</u>. The question of issuing the Bonds shall be placed on the ballot for the election in substantially the following form:

PARK AND RECREATIONAL IMPROVEMENT BONDS 0.875% SALES AND USE TAX

An issue of bonds of the City of Osceola in one or more series in the maximum aggregate principal amount of \$______ for the purpose of financing all or a portion of the costs of acquisition, construction, improvement, expansion, furnishing, equipping, operation and maintenance of an aquatic park, and any necessary parking, landscaping, signage, drainage, concessions, lighting, road and utility improvements related thereto, and, in order to pay the bonds, the levy and pledge of a new seven-eighths of one percent (0.875%) local sales and use tax within the City.

If the bonds are approved, there will be levied within the City a new seven-eighths of one percent (0.875%) sales and use tax, the net collections of which remaining after the State of Arkansas deducts its administrative charges and required rebates, will be used solely to retire or pay obligations with respect to the bonds in accordance with Amendment No. 62 to the Arkansas Constitution. The tax will expire after the bonds have been paid or provision is made therefor in accordance with Arkansas statutes.

Section 4. The election shall be held and conducted and the vote canvassed and the results declared under the law and in the manner now provided for municipal elections unless otherwise provided in the Authorizing Legislation and only qualified voters of the City shall have the right to vote at the election.

Section 5. The result of the election shall be proclaimed by the Mayor and his Proclamation shall be published one time in a newspaper having a general circulation in the City, which Proclamation shall advise that the results as proclaimed shall be conclusive unless attacked in the courts within thirty days after the date of publication.

Section 6. A copy of this Ordinance shall be filed with the Mississippi County Clerk at least 70 days prior to the date of the special election. A copy of this Ordinance shall be given to the Mississippi County Board of Election Commissioners so that the necessary election official and supplies may be provided. A certified copy of this Ordinance shall also be provided to the Commissioner of Revenues of the State of Arkansas as soon is practical.

Section 7. The Mayor and City Clerk, for and on behalf of the City, be and they are hereby authorized and directed to do any and all things necessary to call and hold the special election as herein provided and to perform all acts of whatever nature necessary to carry out the authority conferred by this Ordinance.

<u>Section 8</u>. If the Bonds are approved, the City intends to negotiate with Crews & Associates, Inc. which have assisted the City in preparation of the Bond size and repayment structure, for the sale of the Bonds.

Section 9. The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be separable and if any provision shall for any reason be held illegal or invalid, such holding shall not affect the validity of the remainder of this Ordinance.

Section 10. All ordinances and parts thereof in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

WHEREAS, the Department will oversee all phases of the project.

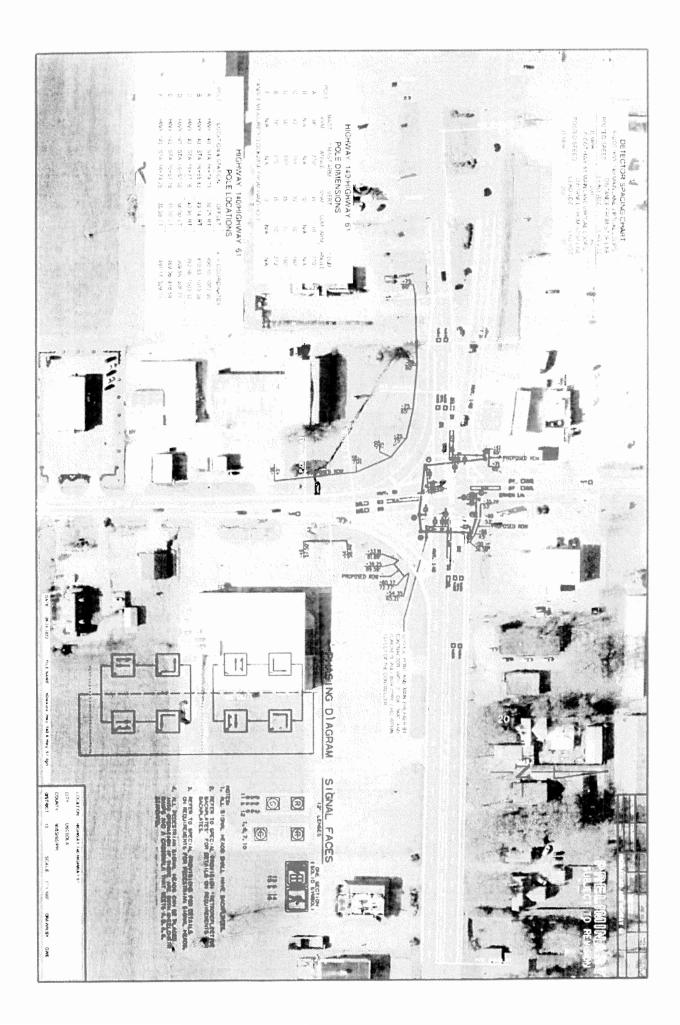
NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF OSCEOLA, ARKANSAS THAT:

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

THIS Memorandum of Understanding (MOU), entered into by and between the University of Memphis ("UofM"), and (CIVIC Organization) (hereby known as "program participant").

WITNESSETH THAT:

WHEREAS, both organizations share a goal of creating a vibrant and economically active Delta region with the infrastructure to accommodate future growth; and

WHEREAS, the partners recognize that in order to achieve their mutual goal, the program participant community must be able to successfully pursue grant funding to create sustainable community growth for it's citizens;

WHEREAS, the UofM and the program participant agree to partner in the Capacity Research Equity Opportunity Pilot Program (CREOPP) to achieve these goals;

NOW THEREFORE, it is mutually agreed as follows:

- I. **Scope of MOU** This MOU is intended to establish the commitments of the University of Memphis and the Program Participant in the CREOPP effort. The total term shall not exceed five (5) years.
- II. **Period of MOU** This MOU shall be effective upon the date of the last signature and will remain in force until the first funding is procured by the program participant community as a result of their participation in CREOPP.
- III. **Activities Under This MOU-** The program participant will actively participate in the CREOPP program activities. The activities include but are not limited to:
 - 3 trips to Memphis
 - o Kickoff event September 7th at 2:00
 - o Two-day grantsmanship and impact investing workshop Oct 23-25
 - o Reverse Pitch Meeting and Graduation June 18th
 - Assistance with coordination a 2-3-day imbedded community studies for your community between September and November to help identify strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats in your community as pertains to grant funding and to better understand the stakeholders working with you in the pursuit of funding.
 - Participation in 3-4 hybrid ideation sessions on different topics (held in partner communities) to hone grant development skills
 - Participation in a Bi-Weekly Writing Group beginning January 2024 to refine grants
 - Participation in surveys and assessments as requested

Additional activities beyond the list provided will be added in consultation with the Program Director and the program participants.

IV. Funding of Activities:

All costs associated with participation in the CREOPP program are covered through a grant provided by the Delta Regional Authority. Travel costs will be arranged on an individual basis with participants in the program. Only those identified as the lead participant(s) for each participant organization will have travel compensated.

V. Termination – Either party may terminate the partnership established by this MOU

upon six months' written notice to the other organization. Terminations will be documented in reporting to the funding agency.

- VII. **Nondiscrimination** The partners agree that no person shall on the grounds of race, color, national origin, gender, sexual orientation, or creed be excluded from participation under the terms of this MOU.
- VIII. **Modification** The terms of this MOU may be changed or modified only by written amendment signed by authorized agents of the University and the Program Participant.
- IX. **Choice of Law-** The laws of the State of Tennessee shall apply to this MOU.
- X. **Counterpart** This MOU may be executed in any number of counterparts, including facsimile or scanned PDF documents. Each such counterpart, facsimile or scanned PDF document shall be deemed an original instrument, and all of which, together, shall constitute one and the same executed MOU.
